Saturday 24 - Sunday 25 June: Millennium Festival Weekend, Alnwick - we will be having a stall at this prestigious event, which celebrates everything that is uniquely Northumbrian, so please come along for some of the time and see what's on offer - and we're ordering some especially fine weather for the occasion! The event is being held on The Pastures below the castle, from 10am until 5pm on both days. Entry is free, but there is a £5 car park charge. There will be plenty of food and drink for sale, as well as a wide range of stalls, tents and activities for the whole family, including some language games etc at our stall.

Monday 26 June: Alnwick Fair - we've taken a stall again at this well-established week-long fair, so come and support us if you can. We're only there for one day, between 9am and 5pm, but we'll have merchandise for sale, there'll be members of the Society to chat with, and we'll be doing some musical turns as well. What more could you ask for? Decent weather perhaps?

Sunday 6 August: Northumbrian Dialect Church Service, Church of the Holy Sepulchre, Ashington, starting at 3pm. This is the Sunday closest to St Oswald's Day which is the 5th of August. Many people regard St

Oswald as the patron saint of Northumberland, so we thought it would be an appropriate day for a Northumbrian Dialect Service. The service is a new venture for the Society, and one we hope everyone will support, whatever their religious persuasion. After the service light refreshments will be served, and there will be an opportunity to chat to friends.

Saturday 12 August: Alnwick Castle Country Fair. We're taking a stall (for one day only!) at this prestigious three-day event covering all kinds of countryside activities, so that we can let people know what we've got to offer.
