AWARDS: First in each class receives a plaque, and holds a trophy for the year. Other placed entrants receive certificates. Awards presented at the Dialect Recital.

NORTHUMBRIAN LANGUAGE WRITING

CLOSING DATE: Saturday 27th March 2004 at Westgate House, except for children's classes, which are Saturday 3rd April 2004. Late entries may be acceptable -- please ring to check.

ENTRY FEE: Children's classes are free. For each other class an entry fee of £ 1 for one item, or £1.50 for two or more items entered, is to be paid on sending/delivering entries and forms. Please make any cheques payable to MNGC.

B3a: NOVICE VERSE: for an original poem in a Northumbrian dialect of up to about 5 minutes' recitation time; manuscripts judged (see Gen. Rule 9) on literary and dialect merits and traditional verse forms.

B3B: OPEN VERSE: as for Class B3a.

B4: JUNIOR DIALECT VERSE: entrants, children aged under 14 on Gathering Saturday; entry, as for Class B3a, except for recital requirement; school multiple entry welcomed,

B5: DIALECT PROSE: for an original prose piece in a Northumbrian dialect; judged as in Class B3a excluding verse requirement. (See Gen. Rule 9.)

B15: JUNIOR DIALECT PROSE: entrants as for Class B4; entry, an original prose piece in a Northumbrian dialect of up to about five minutes' recitation time; no recitation requirement.

Other classes include short stories, history article, song, play.

NORTHUMBRIAN LANGUAGE SPEAKING Saturday 17th April - entry by normal venue ticket St ROBERT'S CHURCH HALL, Oldgate 1.00 for 1.30 p.m.

C18: FINE NORTHUMBRIAN SPEECH: one entry per entrant; a recital of up to 4 minutes' duration, of all or part of any piece of Northumbrian verse or prose, by any writer; entrant to supply judge with a copy of text before reciting; judged on understanding of text, oral delivery and quality & consistency of Northumbrian accents & vocabulary.

C22: STORYTELLING: a story set in Northumberland; the entrant's, another's or traditional; up to 5 minutes; dialect as appropriate; judged on presentation, atmosphere, character, dialect quality & use of memory.
