### **Terry Common 1943-2012**

### **Latest Happnins**

On Tuesday 10th January, Kim gave a talk on the language to members of Longhorsley Local History Society. There were about two dozen members present. The event had been well received, some of our merchandise had been sold, and interest in the work of the NLS was raised.

The pre-Gathering Fund Raising Concert was held in Morpeth Town Hall Ballroom on Friday 10th February. As usual, it was well attended, the acts were enthusiastically received, and much-needed funds for the Gathering were raised.

Kim gave another talk about the language to members of Belford Local History Society on Wednesday 29th February.

### **Morpeth's Olympic Games**

As most of you will know, the Olympic Games are being held in London this summer. What you may not know is that a number of communities in Britain held their own versions of the original Olympic Games long before the modern Games were launched in Greece in 1896. Morpeth was one of those communities.

The Morpeth Olympic Games were held regularly from 1873 until 1958 in a variety of places in the town. The main sports were sprinting, boxing, wrestling, the high jump, the triple jump, and the pole vault.

There is an event on Morpeth's role in the development of the modern Olympics at this year's Gathering. It is a talk by sporting history expert Martin Polley, author of English Heritage's book "The British Olympics", at 6pm on Sunday 15th April in Morpeth Town Hall. Tickets are £5.

Following this event, in the same place, at 7.30pm, there will be a screening of archive films, presented by Keith Hartnell, including **Tom Temple's Morpeth Olympic sequences** and other local sporting heritage films. Tickets are £5.
