National Dialect Day Success

Once again, the Northumbrian Language Society came out tops in this year's National Dialect Day competitions held at Rydal Hall in the Lake District.

Johnny Handle won the Bill O Bowes Cup for a performance in any dialect, and written by the performer. His poem, "Old Man of the Village", was picked out by the judges as the best in a strong competition with twelve other entrants, which included NLS stalwarts Bob Bolam, Nick Short, and Peter Arnold.

Johnny's success means that this cup has been won by the Northumbrian Language Society for three years in a row. Bob Bolam won it in 2012, and Peter Arnold in 2013. Let's hope we can win it again next year, when National Dialect Day moves to Wednesbury in the Black Country!

NLS success this year didn't end with Johnny's win. The Northumbrian team of Bob Bolam, Johnny Handle, Kim Bibby-Wilson and Alex Swailes were awarded the Far Welter'd Trophy for the best overall performance in the Saturday evening's "Hentertyainment" concert. Well done to all of our competitors, and many thanks to all those who attended the event as supporters.
