NLS News

Rosemary Halsey

Kim Bibby-Wilson writes :- Sadly, Rosemary Halsey died recently and I was pleased to represent the NLS at her funeral on 24th October.

Born in 1923, Rosemary was a founding member of the Newcastle branch of the Society in the 1980s along with her husband Alfred who predeceased her, and together they attended many of the Society's general meetings. She was also a leading light of the Fawdon and Coxlodge Local History Society.

Her background was fascinating - she was the niece of the first miner MP, Thomas Burt, who represented the Morpeth constituency, and her interest in language was clearly stimulated by her having spent the first ten years of her life in France thanks to her father's work.

On returning to the north-east she was a pupil of Thomas Moody, the respected and formidable Coxlodge schoolmaster who compiled "The Mid-Northumberland Dialect" dictionary which the Society published.

Rosemary wrote Northumbrian poetry, contributing to the "Northumbrian Words and Ways" booklets produced by Newcastle University's Centre for Continuing Education.

She is survived by her son Michael.

Word Bank of Lost Dialects

There is an exhibition at the South Tyneside Library in South Shields (near the ferry terminal) which runs until September, about "lost" dialect words from the North-east. The exhibition is based on 2,400 words contributed by members of the public who claim that these dialect words have been lost because no-one uses them nowadays. Why not make a visit, and see if you agree that these dialect words are now "lost" and perhaps you could let us know what you think.

Recently, a student from the University of Florence in Italy asked us for help accessing books and material that would help her studies on the Geordie dialect.

Like us, you're probably wondering why an Italian student would want to study our local dialect. It turns out that whilst Italian is the standard language used in public affairs, when it comes to people talking to their family, friends and neighbours, most people use their local dialect - just like us!

We were able to send her some general material about Northumbrian, and she bought some dialect books from us to help with her studies. Recently, she sent us a copy of her dissertation about the Tyneside dialect, and not only did it have a lot of information about our dialect, it was also written in very good English.
